

## **YEAR IN REVIEW**

The Spalding University Library provides resources and services to support the mission of the University. Traditional library services continued during academic year 2018-2019, coupled with many major projects with which the library partnered with other university academic departments and support services.

We continued the expansion of services in the 2nd floor Academic Commons area with the development of a Peer Tutoring program. This program, in collaboration with the Writing Center and Math Lab, transformed our existing Study Hall program and added two work-study positions for Peer Tutors.

The library partnered with the Center for Teaching & Learning to support the teaching and scholarship initiatives of the University. Library meeting rooms hosted CTL faculty book clubs and collection, QEP learning community sessions, and a student success expo. Librarians facilitated the first cohort of the Course Design Institute, a four week asynchronous training for faculty online course developers.



The library was the recipient of a significant archival donation from former Kentucky State Representative Jim Wayne (MFA '12, Doctor of Public Service '18). Library staff supported a Liberal Studies student completing an internship project focused on processing these materials, which consisted of both physical and digital materials.

The implementation of the EBSCO Discovery Service (EDS) tool was a complete overhaul of our public-facing catalog intended to improve usability and enhance access to collections. In addition to improved ability for users to locate materials, EDS offers research tools such as Research Starters and a PICO Question Editor which enhances the research process for our health science and nursing students.

Library survey results indicated many of our patrons wanted more tactile resources which support student learning and campus life available for checkout. Games, gaming devices, and anatomy models have increased in circulation while supporting student critical thinking, communication, and adaptive learning skills.

Library staff contribute to key university taskforces and committees such as strategic planning, digital accessibility, institutional effectiveness, and online learning. The summer of 2019 helped us reflect on the past year and look forward to 2019- 2020 with new and exciting initiatives.



While the vast majority of the libraries' resources are online, physical materials are still well-used. This year we expanded our offerings to include several additional categories of items that were new for AY18-19:

- Laptops for Student checkout




